Week 12 The Places We Go

Phonemic Awareness:

- Rhyming words
- Syllables-count number of parts or syllables in words
- Segmenting words into sounds
- Blending sounds to make words
- Isolating Beginning, ending, and middle sounds

High Frequency Words: go

Review *the, I, can, we, see, a, like, to,* and *students should be able to quickly read all high-frequency words*

Phonics: /k/ Cc initial - cat, cap, Cam

Review: Sounds /m/, /a/, /s/, /p/, /t/, /i/ and /n/

Decodable words to practice reading and spelling with independence: can, cat, Cam, cap, nap, pin, tin, Min, pan, tan, man, it, sit, pit, Tim, mitt, mist, map, sap, tap, Pap, am, Sam, Tam, Pam, past, mast, stamp

Grammar: Sentence fluency

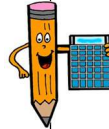
Vocabulary: *local, routine, neighborhood, volunteer, intelligent*

HANDWRITING: Cc

- Practice writing decodable words (see above)
- Writing sentences
- Review writing the letter Mm, Ss, Aa and Pp, Tt, Ii, Nn
- Write numbers 0-20 out of sequence

Thanksgiving, Colorful Counting Trees, caribou, The Gingerbread Man

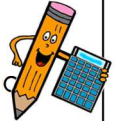


MATH
